

B.I.S.T.

Broadmoor Elementary School has a school-wide discipline plan called B.I.S.T. (Behavior Intervention Support Team). The purpose of the B.I.S.T. strategy is to help bring about lasting changes in student's attitudes towards themselves and others around them so that they can be productive students in the classroom, in control of their own behavior, and find acceptable solutions to their problems.

The goal of the B.I.S.T. plan is to enable Broadmoor to continue to be a well-organized school where values, communication, and structure help promote a safe environment for all students. The staff at Broadmoor believe they can help children accept responsibility for student behavior by helping students become aware of changes that they can control: attitude, behavior, work habits, empathy for others, sense of responsibility, beliefs, peer groups, and desire to change.

When a teacher calls to discuss a student's plan, it is simply to inform the parents. Instead of getting angry with the child, simply encourage your child to be accountable and follow the plan made to be more successful at school.

Area Information

Louisburg, Kansas is a growing community with a population of approximately 3,500. Louisburg is located in eastern Miami County, about 25 miles south of the Kansas City metropolitan area. While local businesses and farming offer employment, the larger portion of the population is employed in the Kansas City area.

Louisburg Unified School District No. 416 is a public school district serving approximately 1,700 students in pre-kindergarten through twelfth grade. USD 416 is comprised of 156 square miles.

Improvement Continues

Historically, Broadmoor Elementary School has hit the state Standard of Excellence in Reading and Math. BES continuously looks for ways to improve the quality of education students receive. Like every school in USD 416, BES has identified its priority areas for improvement, which we call school improvement plans. LES Site Council, made up of parents, business and community volunteers, and staff, advise and guide the school improvement plan. Our goals focus on math, reading, and writing skills.

A Safe Environment for Learning

Students must have a safe and orderly environment in which to learn if they are to succeed. When surveyed, Broadmoor Elementary parents, students, and staff report they feel safe at our school. No violent acts were reported at LES during the 2008-09 school year.

Classroom Programs

- Reading anthologies, leveled readers, and trade books in each classroom to enhance reading instruction
- Renaissance Learning with Accelerated Reader, STAR Reader, and Accelerated Math.
- Weekly and extra “as-needed” visits to the well-stocked, automated library media center
- Strong math program utilizing manipulatives and hands-on activities, including *Math Investigations*
- Hands-on science activities emphasized through FOSS kits
- Computers in each classroom, two COWS (mobile computers on wheels) and two computer labs to support instruction and enhance learning—one to two times weekly
- Physical education class every day
- Band offered to fifth grade students
- Music classes two to three times weekly
- Art classes once weekly
- Cross-grade interaction in reading and science
- Leveling approach in reading and math

Special Services

- Certified staff to work with learning disabled students within their regular classrooms as well as in other environments if needed
- Certified teacher to provide enrichment for identified gifted students
- Speech Therapist
- Occupational Therapist
- School Psychologist
- School Social Worker

- Site Council to provide community input into school goals
- Trained student assistance team to work with needs of students

Kansas State Accreditation Promotes Improvement Process

The school improvement process is an ongoing cycle of gathering and analyzing data about our school and our students' achievement, setting goals for improving student learning, implementing change, analyzing results, and setting new goals. It is through this process that our school is accredited by the Kansas State Board of Education. Broadmoor Elementary School has always received full accreditation each year.
