Area Information

Louisburg, Kansas is a growing community with a population of approximately 4000. Louisburg is located in eastern Miami County, about 25 miles south of the Kansas City metropolitan area. While local businesses and farming offer employment, the larger portion of our population is employed in the Kansas City area.

Louisburg United School District No. 416 is a public school district serving approximately 1700 students in grades PreK-12. USD 416 is comprised of 156 square miles.

Background Information

Due to growth in population, the people of USD 416 built a new high school which opened in the fall of 2002. At that time, middle school students moved into the old high school and Louisburg elementary students claimed the former elementary/middle school as their own. Today, the middle school serves approximately 400 students in grades six through eight.
